

Troop 210 Activity Form for December 27 - 30, 2011

We're going Winter Camping at Camp La-N-Che!

*Please read everything below to **Be Prepared** for this fantastic event!*

Place: Camp La-No-Che, Central Florida Council Boy Scout Camp, Paisley, FL.

Times:

11/26/11: Everyone meets at FUMCWG @ 5:00 pm to load personal gear and equipment.

11/27/11: everyone meets at FUMCWG @ 7:30 am for departure. ***(As always, all Scouts must have compass, whistle and flashlight.)*** If you are on time, you are late! Tail lights will be 7:45 am or sooner. Eat breakfast before coming to the Church. No stops on the way.

11/30/11: Expect return to FUMCWG and expect release to parents @ 6:00 pm. Remember our rule is that no one leaves until all gear is put away. Please plan accordingly.

Equipment: Please bring only 3 bundles. A duffle bag, footlocker or backpack, sleeping bag and folding camp chair. Make sure that your name is on each bundle. We will be sleeping in the tents provided by Camp La-No-Che. Bring bug spray and closed shoes!

Plan & Pack for:

Food is provided by Camp La-No-Che, including lunch on day of departure. As the name indicates, this is winter camping. Plan and pack for cold nights and mild days. Layer clothing is recommended. An extra blanket for most sleeping bags is recommended. Closed toe shoes is mandatory. If the weather permits, the pool might be open.

Depending upon attendance, we will take the bus OR we'll need extra adults to help transport participants in their own vehicles; quantity TBD.

Fees for Campers (excluding Sunday lunch)

1. Fuel fee is \$5 per person.
2. Camping Fee is \$115 per scout and \$55 per adult. Fees to be paid to no later than December 12th. Checks to be made out to Troop 210. If a scout desires to attend following the December 12th deadline, please contact Mr. Longshore at 407.443.9792. Attendance after the 12th will be by space available.
3. Merit Badge fees will be collected on December 19th. Checks to be made out to Central Florida Council.

4. Permission form due 12/12/2011.
5. Need to adult leaders who will be able to spend the evenings at camp. Will also need adults who can fill in during the day if one of the leaders needs to leave and attend to work issues.

Other Miscellaneous Notes: No electronic devices (phones, ipods, MP3 players, walkmans, radios, game-boys, etc.) allowed once we arrive at camp. They must remain in the vehicle, or turned into an adult leader.

Class A uniforms will be worn to morning and evening flags. All other times scout appropriate clothing. A scout appropriate hat will be worn at all times.

Bring water bottles. Although the temperatures will be cold to cool, dehydration still happens. Water bottles, with water, will be carried at all times.

Merit badge class forms to be turned in to Mrs. Street no later than December 12, 2011. Scouts can also email their request to Mrs. Street at abcdstreet@bellsouth.net. Please indicate your second choice of class in case your primary is full.

Scouts need to coordinate with Ms. Nenninger for Blue Cards. We will not have access to Blue Cards at La-No-Che. They are required for the merit badge classes. No Blue Card – no credit for the class. Ms. Nenninger can be contact at troop210advancements@gmail.com

For the snack shack, scout shop and evening activities, plan on \$60 per scout.

No food or snacks in the tents at any time.
